CONTEST GUIDELINES:


- Entries **MUST** contain SSFHC's entire written theme:

What Is Fair Housing?

In 1968, fifty years ago this spring, the federal Fair Housing Act was passed. Before 1968, doors were closed to many people simply because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, family status and disability. The Fair Housing Act opens doors for many people by guaranteeing everyone the right to rent or buy housing on a fair and equal basis.

Housing discrimination denies people the right to choose the neighborhoods in which they want to live. This affects families with children, persons with disabilities, and people from all racial and ethnic backgrounds. Housing discrimination also denies <u>everyone</u> the right to enjoy the diversity our community has to offer.

Who Does the Law Protect?

The federal Fair Housing Act protects all of us from housing discrimination. The Fair Housing Act protects us against discrimination based on race, color, national origin, religious beliefs, sex, family status, or disability. Nevada state law offers additional protections against discrimination based on ancestry, sexual orientation and gender identity/expression.

Why Participate?

April is National Fair Housing Month. The 22nd annual SSFHC Poster Contest emphasizes the importance of realizing that everyone is protected by the Fair Housing Act.

This poster contest is intended to foster a better sense of understanding, acceptance, and appreciation of the diversity in our neighborhoods and throughout our community. Show the community your vision of a neighborhood where everyone can choose where they want and can afford to live.

Living as neighbors, we learn to appreciate our similarities and our differences.

Who are we?

Silver State Fair Housing Council (SSFHC) is a private, non-profit corporation that promotes equal housing opportunity in Nevada. SSFHC advocates for fair housing by providing a comprehensive program of outreach, education, and enforcement activities. With offices in Reno and Las Vegas, SSFHC serves housing consumers and providers throughout the state, acting as a resource to ensure that all Nevadans benefit from the provisions of fair housing law.
